## PASTOR’S MESSAGE

*“Peter said to them, ‘Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ so that your sins may be forgiven; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit... So those who welcomed his message were baptized, and that day about three thousand persons were added. They devoted themselves to the apostles’ teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers.” ~Acts 2:38, 41-42*

A few weeks ago, we celebrated the liturgical festival day commemorating the “Baptism of Our Lord.” That same day, we baptized Todd and Evelyn Davis. In an article of *Living Lutheran* last month, baptism is also mentioned: Retired pastor Frank Honeycutt writes, “Baptism shapes our Christian identity. For a Christian, life begins and is viewed through this watery lens. You were ordained for ministry in baptism, a sacrament that exceeds (in biblical importance) any ordination.” And baptism served as a major topic of our January gathering of “Theology on Tap.”

I think it’s fair to say, though, that we Lutherans haven’t always been the best at keeping baptism front and center in our Christian walk. What I mean by this is not that we’ve necessarily been unfaithful, but that we weren’t always *intentional* about remembering our baptism. I know in the church I grew up, the font was usually covered and only opened when there *was* a baptism. At Bethel our font has wheels on the bottom—convenient, sure! But all too easy to push aside when it “gets in our way.”

But baptism is *supposed* to get in our way – it’s supposed to be central to our Christian journey, primary to who we are in Jesus Christ! And why wouldn’t we want it to be? When writing about the benefits of baptism, Martin Luther suggested that baptism “brings about forgiveness of sins, redeems from death and the devil, and gives eternal salvation to all who believe it, as the words and promise of God declare.” As Lutherans, baptism is one of our two sacraments (along with holy communion). It is such an immense gift of God’s mercy! All too often, though we know it happened, we don’t do much reflecting on it.

So at our most recent “Theology on Tap,” we also discussed ways we might bring baptism to mind! Now just coming to worship will get you much of the way there, because both “confession and forgiveness” (which harkens back to baptism) and “thanksgiving for baptism” are common elements of our Sunday service. Even on days you’re only half awake, you might even be rudely awakened (but hopefully pleasantly reminded) of that baptism and its significance when sprinkled with living water from the font! Even outside worship, there are all kinds of ways to remember your baptism, too!

Making the sign of the cross on your forehead or across your whole body can help us remember it. Displaying some kind of wall hanging at home – a cross or scripture verse – can help us remember as we enter and exit our homes. Remembering our “baptismal birthday” by lighting our baptismal (or any) candle or saying a special prayer can mark the occasion and help us give thanks for this extraordinary gift. Even just pondering our baptism when we stand in the shower or take a bath can cause us to recall and reflect on who, and whose, we are.

This month, consider taking time out to remember your baptism. As you do, may you encounter, again and again, God’s presence, grace, forgiveness, and love.

### **Vitality Quick Check:**

As part of our work with the Nebraska Synod, Pastor Rebecca in collaboration with the ELCA’s Research and Evaluation office developed a congregational “quick check” to assess congregational vitality and sustainability as a tool for all 250 congregations in the Nebraska Synod.

One way to measure growth and vitality of a congregation is by quantitative measures (growing numbers in worship, more active members participating in activities beyond worship, etc.). Another important measure of a congregation’s vitality, however, is qualitative (how well areas of ministry are being carried out

by the congregation). ELCA Research and Evaluation has identified 15 qualities that healthy congregations do well. In December of 2015, the Bethel Council took the Quick Check to assess Bethel’s health based on those 15 qualities below. On January 15 (the day of our annual meeting), 38 Bethel participants took the Quick Check again to see where we are a year later. Below are the averaged results.

Worship Nurtures People's faith

Deepens people's relationship with God

A clear sense of mission

Excitement about the congregation's future

Always ready to try something new

A positive force in the community

Works for social justice/advocacy

Incorporates new members into congregational life

Seeks out and uses the gifts of all members

Builds strong, healthy relationships among members

Manages disagreements in a healthy, respectful manner

Address social concerns (helping those in need)

Equip members to share their faith with others

Interact with the local community

Help members live out their faith in their daily lives

Total vitality score: 3.72

When the council took the Quick Check a year ago, the total average vitality score was 3.33. This is on a 5-point scale, 5 being very good health.

Obviously this is not an apples-to-apples comparison as more people took the Quick Check this year, but we can hope that in one year, our congregational health has improved. Worship nurturing people’s faith remained the highest score both years. Last year, the lowest score was “always ready to try something new.” This year, it was “works for social justice and advocacy.” Thank you to all who contributed to the Quick Check as it can help our council discern plans for our future!

### **BETHEL NEWS:**

#### **Council Retreat 2017:**

The Bethel Lutheran council met for an all-day retreat on Saturday, January 21, 2017. The retreat started with discussion and reflection on an article authored by Pastor Dave Daubert titled *Luther’s Priesthood of Believers: A Simple Model*

*for 21<sup>st</sup> Century Disciples.* In his article, Daubert reminds Lutherans that all Christians, not just ordained priests, are transformed by the power of Jesus Christ, and the functions of all believers are to sacrifice, pray, and to proclaim the gospel.

Following this discussion we turned our attention to Bethel by reviewing our 2016 goals and listing all ministries and church activities that occur at Bethel throughout the year. This list was made with our four committees in mind: Stewardship & Service, Worship & Education, Evangelism & Public Relations, and Property & Finance.
