PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Can a woman forget her nursing child, or show no compassion for the child of her womb? Even these may forget, yet I will not forget you. See, I have inscribed you on the palms of my hands.

Isaiah 49:15-16

By the time you read this, we will have added a second child to our family, and we look forward to introducing him/her to you all soon as we wrap up our parental leave! This is a season of family celebrations: graduations, weddings, Mother's Day and Father's Day around the corner. At Bethel, we look forward to celebrating with family and friends on Mother's Day with our Service of Musical praise, a culmination of hard work for many of our musically gifted participants: choir, band, brass, vocal ensemble, and additional special instruments. I am also writing this article in March, which is of course Women's History Month. We have just come from installing our new Women of the ELCA officers at Bethel. I also want you all to know what a wonderful ministry many of our women AND men participated in when we hosted Crossroads Connection Prison Ministry at Bethel at the end of February. We had 93 worshippers, including many Bethel members and musicians, prisoners, their families, and volunteers. Pilgrim Hall was full of people, good food, and fellowship after the service. It was a powerful extension of Bethel's family caring for God's larger family.

This Crossroads ministry experience and upcoming Mother's and Father's Days has led me to reflect on God's unconditional love for us as our heavenly parent. I have mixed feelings about Mother's Day, personally. In 2014, I suffered a miscarriage right around this time. It was a very difficult time to go from expecting to be a mother to knowing there would be no Mother's Day celebration for me – maybe ever. It was a challenging period for my faith in God. Of course, this Mother's Day and last year's were much different for me, and it is an example for me of how God is faithful. Around this time, though, I try to remember how I felt and how many people feel if they have an estranged relationship with their

parent(s), have a beloved parent who has recently died, or desire to be a parent but can't be one.

I take great comfort in the images in scripture that describe God as a parent – that God will never forget me even if I am hurt by my earthly parents or fail myself to be all I would hope to be as a parent for my children. We are traditionally familiar with addressing God as “Our Father,” and this is how Jesus addresses God most often. There are also passages in scripture that refer to God as a mothering figure, as in the Isaiah verses above. It may be a challenging idea for some of us to think of God also as a mother because we imagine God to be male, but for many men and women this is a healing image. We have a God who will NEVER forget us – we are inscribed on the palm of God’s hands. This Mother’s Day, we can honor not just our biological mothers but also those who have served as mentors and mother figures for us. Some of these women have been the face of God to us: Sunday School teachers, youth leaders, day care providers, aunts, godparents, and grandmothers. They have taught us the faith and witnessed to God’s great love for us in their strong faith. Whatever complex emotions this Mother’s Day may bring for you, may you be strengthened with the knowledge of God’s unfailing, unforgettable love for you.

500th Anniversary of the Reformation

Prayer Service May 1, 2017 at 7pm at St. Cecilia’s Cathedral. Archbishop George Lucas of the Omaha Roman Catholic Archdiocese will preside and Bishop Brian Maas of the Nebraska Synod, ELCA will be preaching. This is a historic worship opportunity for our Lutheran and Roman Catholic

communities to worship together and commemorate what caused a devastating division in the Christian church. While Martin Luther never intended to leave the Catholic Church, his firm stand and challenge to reform the Church has led us to the point of being able to worship together once again. If you can’t make this prayer service, another is scheduled at Kountze Memorial Lutheran Church on September 11, 2017 at 7pm with Archbishop George Lucas preaching and Bishop Brian Maas presiding.

The Nebraska Synod Assembly is June 2-3, 2017. Please pray for Bethel’s voting members and Pastors Rich and Rebecca as they make decisions for our larger church. This assembly’s focus is “We are Lutheran,” lifting up the 500th anniversary of the Reformation. We will be adopting amendments to the synod’s constitution, electing synod council members, and adopting the 2018 budget. ELCA Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton will be one of the keynote speakers and presenters as well.
